

Cambridge English Qualifications (Computer Based Test – Digital) Frequently Asked Questions

1. What are the Cambridge English Digital Tests?

These are online versions of A2 Key, B1 Preliminary, B2 First, and C1 Advanced exams offered by Cambridge English, designed to be taken on a computer in an official exam centre.

2. Which Cambridge English levels are available for the digital test?

You can take A2 Key, B1 Preliminary, B2 First, and C1 Advanced digitally.

3. When can I take the digital test?

Cambridge English Digital Tests will be available **every Thursday** weekly at British Council Kanna Lan Office, Yangon.

4. Where can I take the digital exam?

You must take the test at an official British Council test centre, Yangon Only. Online/home testing is not available at this time.

5. How do I register for the digital test?

You can register through the British Council registration link. Full details will be provided upon registration, including test instructions and login credentials.

6. How long is the exam?

The digital test format and timing are the same as the paper-based version, typically between 2–4 hours depending on the exam level.



7. Is there a difference between digital and paper-based exams?

No. Both test types follow the same content and standards. The main difference is the **test delivery mode**—digital tests are taken on a computer and offer additional benefits from using digital features like highlighting, note-taking, and automatic word count aid in the exam.

8. When will I get my results?

You'll receive your digital test results faster—usually within **5 to 10 working days** after your exam date online. You can collect physical certificates after 2 - 4 weeks of online result released dates.

9. What do I need to bring on the test day?

Bring your original ID, confirmation email, and arrive at least 30 minutes early. Headphones and test equipment will be provided at the test centre.

10.. Can I use my own laptop or headphones for the digital test?

No, all equipment including computers and headphones will be provided by the British Council at the test centre to ensure consistent technical quality and a secure exam environment.
